# Sound Mapping

Guiding Question: What does our neighborhood sound like? What do these sounds tell us about our community?


Goal: Make a map of neighborhood sounds

Materials:

Paper, Pens/ Pencils/ Markers, Phone or camera to document

## Steps:


1. Use paper and a pen/ marker to make columns to organize sounds. Your three columns should include: **Soft, Medium, Loud**



2. Choose a place in your neighborhood where you can sit comfortably.



3. Set a timer for at least 5 minutes. Use the columns to write down all the sounds you hear.





Create a map key by organizing similar kinds of sounds.





Assign each sound a different style of line.

Use your lines to draw circles for the sounds you hear. Draw the soft sounds in the middle of your paper.




7.

Draw circles within circles for sounds that you hear more than once.




8.

Draw medium sounds around the soft sounds.




9.
